#### OTHER CONSUMER INFORMATION

A total of 951 University of Puerto Rico - Rio Piedras students entered loan repayment in 2016. After three years, 6.7% of these students (64 out of 951) defaulted on their loans.

The student loan default rate at UPR Rio Piedras is 6.7%. This is significantly lower than the national default rate of 10.1%, which is a good sign that you'll be able to pay back your student loans.

A total of 951 University of Puerto Rico - Rio Piedras students entered loan repayment in 2016. After three years, **6.7%** of these students (64 out of 951) defaulted on their loans. The lower the default rate, the better!

# Projected Costs Between \$86,657 and \$301,295 For a Four Year Degree. Between \$40,021 and \$108,480 For a Two Year Degree.

It can be a bit scary to look at the total projected cost of a college education over the course of a multi-year degree, however, doing so will help you better understand the financial commitment you are making.

The overall cost for on-campus, in-state students to attend University of Puerto Rico - Rio Piedras in 2019 - 2020 was \$19,950. To calculate future costs, we looked at the prior five years of data and determined that this cost increased an average of 11.7% each year.

If this trend continues, we expect the full cost for incoming freshmen to be \$24,882 during their first year. By their senior year, that cost will be approximately \$34,659, for a bachelor degree candidate (\$27,789 for an associate degree candidate) for a total of \$118,365 over the course of four years (\$52,671 over the course of two years). These numbers do *not* take into consideration financial aid, which reduces this overall cost by varying amounts per student.

The cost for out-of-state students is more, with an overall expected four-year cost of \$112,058 based on a yearly growth rate of 7.1%. The expected two-year cost is \$52,166.

Remember, the full costs quoted above are not what most students will pay, and the net price varies quite a bit based on individual circumstances.
